HISTORY

In 1968, a group of law students led by Algernon Johnson ("A.J.") Cooper founded the Black American Law Students Association on the campus of New York University Law School in order to promote the interests of Black and minority law students entering the legal profession. The organization, renamed the National Black Law Students Association ("NBLSA"), was established as a not-for-profit organization on December 19, 1969. Today NBLSA is a nationally-recognized 501(c)(3) organization, and the largest student-run organization in the country with 210 local chapters in six regions, and a reach of over 15,000 law student members and alumni.

MISSION

The mission of NBLSA is to increase the number of culturally responsible Black and minority attorneys who excel academically, succeed professionally, and positively impact the community. The 6 Regions of NBLSA work to advance this mission throughout the United States and Canada by advocating for diversity in legal education and in the legal profession.

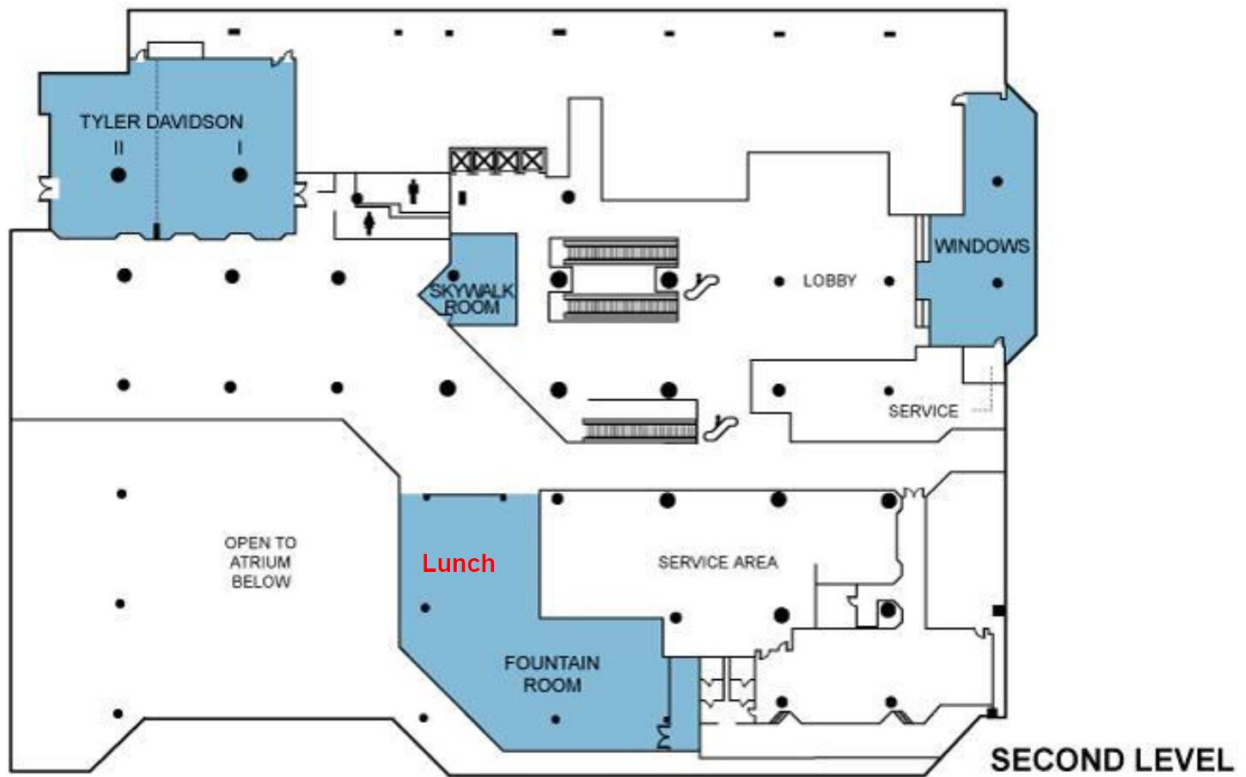

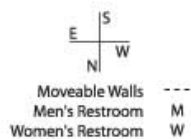

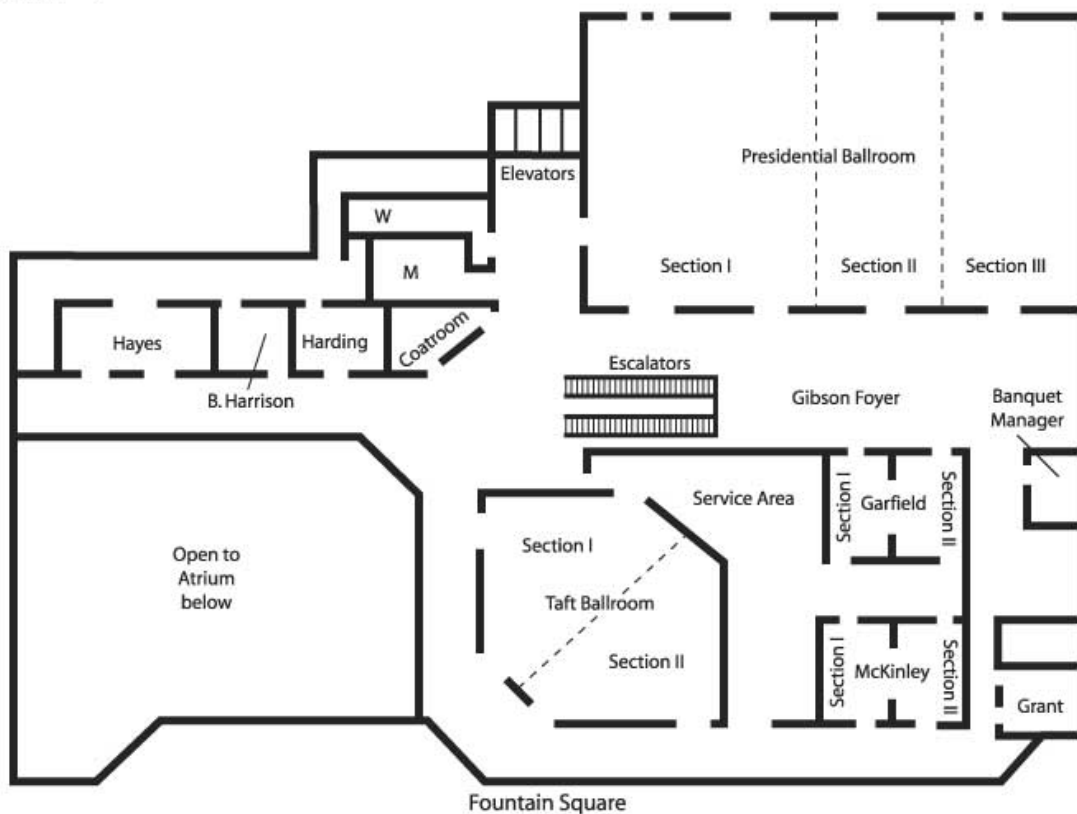
